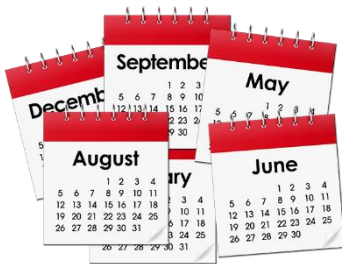

About the Jubilee Trust



The **Jubilee Trust** was started in 1985 by a man called Lionel Brierly.

Lionel Brierly got support from **CCS Disability Action** when he was a child.

The **Jubilee Trust wants** to support disabled people to:



- achieve their goals
- learn and do new things
- get more education
- have a better life.





The **Jubilee Trust** thinks disabled people are important in the community.



Every year the **Jubilee Trust** has more than 2 hundred thousand dollars to give to people.

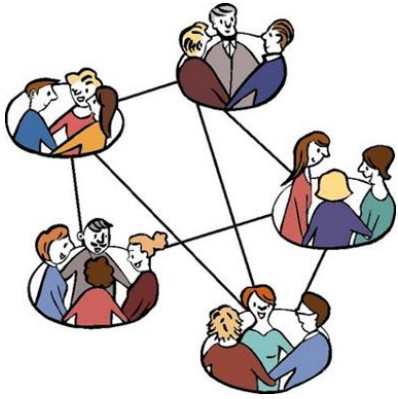
People can apply to get part of the 2 hundred thousand dollars.



To apply for some of the **Jubilee Trust** money you need to have a physical disability and live in **1** of these places:



- Northland
- Auckland
- Eastern Bay of Plenty.



The **Jubilee Trust** wants:

- to support disabled people to join in the community
- people that have good ideas on how to use the **Jubilee Trust** money to apply for the money.



What the Jubilee Trust can offer



The money the **Jubilee Trust** can give to people is called a **grant**.

The **Jubilee Trust** has 3 kinds of **grant**:



1. **Scholarships**
2. **Education Grants**
3. **General Grants**



Tertiary study means any study that happens after you have finished secondary school.

Tertiary study can be study or training:

- at a **tertiary** education organisation, like a University or Polytech.



Scholarships:



Scholarships are for 7 thousand 5 hundred dollars.



They can be used by students to pay for study costs in their last year of **tertiary study**.



A **scholarship** might be right for you to apply for if you can show:

- you get good marks for your **tertiary study**
- things you have done well
- things you have started and finished



- things you have done to help disabled people
- the scholarship will really help you
- how much you can pay from your own money for your **tertiary study**.

Education Grants:



Education Grants can be up to 2 thousand 5 hundred dollars.



They can be used by students to pay for study costs in their 1st or 2nd year of **tertiary study**.

An **Education Grant** might be right for you to apply for if you can show:



- you do not have much money
- things you have done to get better at something
- things you have done well
- things you have started and finished





- the education grant will really help you
- how much you can pay from your own money for your **tertiary study**.

General Grants:



General Grants can be up to 2 thousand 5 hundred dollars.



General Grants are for things you need to have a better life.

A **General Grant** might be right for you to apply for if you can show:



- you do not have much money
- things you have done to get better at something
- things you have done well
- things you have started and finished



- the grant will really help you
- how much you can pay from your own money for the thing you want to get.



You can apply for more than 1 kind of grant.



1 person or family can get **no more than 5 thousand dollars** from these grants.




The **Jubilee Trust** can give people grants for things that are not paid for by the Government.



The **Jubilee Trust** can give you money for the equipment you need to get.

How to apply to the Jubilee Trust

To apply for a grant from the **Jubilee Trust** send us this information:

- your name
- your address
- your phone number
- the kind of grant you want to get
- about your disability
- a letter from someone that supports you to get the grant
- how much the thing you want to spend the grant money on costs
- if you have checked if you can get funding support from another place or not





- 2 quotes from different places to show how much the thing you want to spend the grant money on costs
- how much you can pay from your own money for the thing you want to get
- how much money you want to get from the **Jubilee Trust**
- how the money you get from the **Jubilee Trust** will be used
- how what you want to get will help you.

A **transcript** is a piece of paper from your course that has your course marks on it.

You can ask your course to give you a copy of your **transcript**.

If you want to get a **Scholarship** or an **Education Grant** send us this information too:



- a **transcript** of your marks from last year
- proof that you have enrolled for the course you want to do
- proof that you have got a place on the course you want to do.

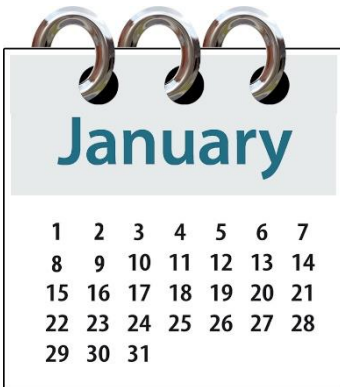

When to apply to the Jubilee Trust



Every year:

- the **Jubilee Trust** meets **4 times** to decide who can get a grant
- you can apply for a **Scholarship** 1 time
- the due date to apply for a **Scholarship** is **15 January**
- you can apply for an **Education Grant** 4 times
- you can apply for a **General Grant** 4 times.



The due date to apply for **Education Grants** and **General Grants** is the 1st week of:



- February
- May
- August
- November.

6 weeks after you apply for the grant the **Jubilee Trust** will let you know whether you have got the grant or not.

You can only use the money for what you said you will use it for.



From the time you get the grant you will have **12 months** to write a report that says how the money was used.

About the Cook Opie Trust

The **Cook Opie Trust** was started in 1961 by a woman called June Opie.



The **Opie Trust** joined with the **Alan Cook Memorial Trust** and was called the **Cook Opie Trust**.



The **Cook Opie Trust** has grants for computers and equipment.



People with a physical disability that have no money to buy computers and equipment can apply for a **Cook Opie Trust** grant.



The **Cook Opie Trust** wants to support people with a physical disability to:



- be heard



- read

- write



- speak




- get around

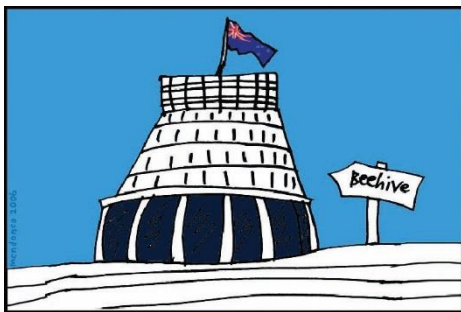

- if you have checked if you can get funding support from another place or not
- can the Government pay for what you want to get?
- how much you can pay from your own money for the thing you want to get
- 2 quotes from different places to show how much the thing you want to spend the grant money on costs
- a letter from someone that supports you getting the grant.

Cook Opie Trust grants are paid to the company that supplies the equipment or service.



Every year the due date to apply for a **Cook Opie Trust** grant is the 1st week of:

- February
- May
- August
- November.

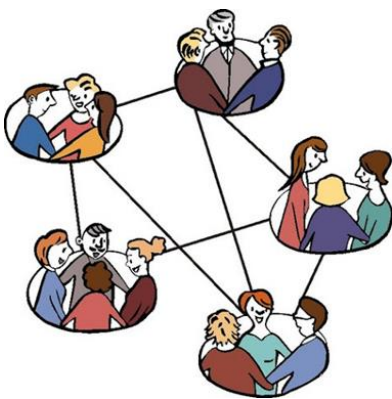
